# REGIS' TOP TEN STEPS TO ENROLLMENT SUCCESS

## 01. LET'S CELEBRATE YOUR ADMISSION TO REGIS.

Your Admissions Counselor is here with all kinds of important information to help get you started and guide you through the steps in starting school. In the coming months, expect additional emails that will help guide you along in your preparation. If you have questions, call your Admissions Counselor to keep things moving.

## 02. SET YOURSELF UP FOR REGIS.

Activate your RegisNet account. This will become your username and password for all things Regis, so don't delay!

To do so:

- Go to [webadvisor.regis.edu](http://webadvisor.regis.edu)
- Click Change My Password
- Under Set Up Your Password, log in with your RegisNet ID
- Create a new password

Once logged in, access [webadvisor.regis.edu](http://webadvisor.regis.edu) to view your info. To access your Regis email, go to [email.regis.edu](http://email.regis.edu). Your Regis email will be the primary form of communication, so be sure to be sure to check it regularly.

## 03. GET CONNECTED.

Your Admission Counselor will provide you with a login for your cohort's private Facebook group. This group is also a great way to get to know your future classmates and connect with potential roommates!

## 04. PLAN YOUR TUITION PAYMENTS.

Investing time into your education is an important part of this new journey. To ensure your education is uninterrupted, come up with a financial plan that accommodates paying for your education and your life at the same time. Your Admissions Counselor will provide you with contact information for your Financial Aid Counselor. They are a great resource and can answer your questions about Financial Aid.

If you're seeking financial aid, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at [fafsa.ed.gov](http://fafsa.ed.gov). List Regis University, Federal Code **001363**, in the school section of the FAFSA. In addition, your Social Security number will be needed to connect your FAFSA and your Regis account. Contact your Admissions Counselor about securely sending your SSN to Regis.

## 05. COMPLIANCE.

Regis University's Compliance Office will be sending detailed information regarding your program's compliance requirements. You should work to complete these requirements right away. Some items may take a few minutes, while others may require follow up appointments. All compliance documents **MUST** be submitted and approved by the deadline provided by the Compliance Office! ## 06. PROVIDE US WITH ANY MISSING INFO.

Acceptance to Regis is conditional based on the completion of all program requirements. Official transcripts for all coursework completed after you submitted your application will need to be sent directly to Regis University. **If we didn't ask for it, you're good!**

## 07. BOOKS AND REGISTRATION.

We will take care of getting you registered! Textbooks are available one month before class begins. Through the Regis Bookstore you can purchase—or rent—paperback and digital texts! Your custom book lists can be found in WebAdvisor at [webadvisor.regis.edu](http://webadvisor.regis.edu). After you log in, click on Students on the left side of the screen. You will then see the Buy My Books link listed under Registration. Waiting on financial aid? Contact the bookstore and ask for a voucher that'll let you get your books before your financial aid disbursement arrives—[regis.edu/bookstore](http://regis.edu/bookstore) or call 800.798.4153.

## 08. CHECK YOUR NEW STUDENT RESOURCES.

You will be notified by your Admissions Counselor when you have access to New Student Resources. You will access this "course" resource in WorldClass with your RegisNet log in at [worldclass.regis.edu](http://worldclass.regis.edu). In this course you will find important program information such as your student handbook and additional resources to help you start on the right foot.

## 09. SHARE THE NEWS WITH YOUR NETWORK.

Going to school can be hectic, but you have friends to help with life's logistics. Whether you share news via Facebook, Twitter, or carrier pigeon, let everyone know you're going to Regis. They might offer to help.
